

High School College Prep Timeline

Year-by-year roadmap from 9th grade through college applications — for homeschool families.

9th Grade

Academics

Establish strong study habits. Start high school transcript. Aim for 4–5 solid courses.

Testing

No tests required yet. Explore PSAT format for awareness.

Extracurriculars

Start building consistent activities — co-op, sports, music, volunteering, or part-time work.

Planning

Research college types (liberal arts vs university vs community college vs trade).

10th Grade

Academics

Stay consistent. Consider dual enrollment if available in your state.

Testing

Take the PSAT/NMSQT in fall (practice run — scores don't count for scholarships yet).

Extracurriculars

Deepen commitments from 9th grade. Leadership or creative output is a plus.

Planning

Start a draft college list. Visit a campus if possible.

11th Grade

Academics

Hardest year academically. Take your strongest courses. Dual enrollment if possible.

Testing

SAT / ACT: take in spring. PSAT/NMSQT in fall (National Merit eligibility).

Extracurriculars

Take on leadership. Start any major personal project, research, or business.

Planning

Finalize college list. Request homeschool portfolio guidelines from target schools.

Summer

Visit colleges. Consider a summer program, internship, or rigorous online course.

12th Grade

Academics

Finish strong. Transcript must be complete and polished before applications.

Testing

Retake SAT/ACT in fall if needed. Some schools are test-optional — check each.

Applications

Common App opens Aug 1. Early Decision/Action deadlines: Nov 1–15. Regular: Jan 1.

Documents

Finalize transcript, course descriptions, and activity list. Get evaluator letter if required.

Financial Aid

FAFSA opens Oct 1. File as early as possible. Research homeschool-specific scholarships.

Homeschool portfolio tip: Contact each college's admissions office directly — homeschool requirements vary widely by school. Most colleges now have a dedicated homeschool admissions process. Ask early and follow up.
